On Sunday, April 19, Bard's Graduate Vocal Arts Program will present "First Songs," featuring a world premiere of a Longy commission and five Boston premieres at Edward M. Pickman Concert Hall at 3 p.m. Internationally renowned soprano and Bard Vocal Arts Program Artistic Director Dawn Upshaw, will perform with pianist and Bard faculty Kayo Iwama, the singers of the program, and the Bard Conservatory Collaborative Piano Fellows. The concert will feature the world premiere of "Garden Songs" by the acclaimed Argentinean composer Pablo Ortiz, a Terezín Music Foundation Commission written for Dawn Upshaw, whose text is poetry by Louise Glück. The students come from Longy's vocal, opera, piano and collaborative piano departments. Ms. Upshaw and Ms. Iwama will coach all participants on musical expression, text, and collaboration.
